It has been a joy to journey together during this season of Lent (40 days beginning Ash Wednesday), as we have heard Life-Changing stories of what God is doing in our brothers

and sisters lives and as people encounter Jesus Christ. Thank you to Taylor Bastian, Leland Wenzel, and Jesse Klosterboer for sharing part of your story of faith with us on Wednesday evenings! It has been such an encouragement to hear what God is doing and to be trusted with your words. On Sundays we have heard of Nicodemus and the woman from Samaria. The learning continues with the healing of the man born blind and the raising of Lazarus. These are stories of Jesus' healing actions and words of invitation and salvation. These are moving and powerful stories of lives being changed when encountering Jesus. Jesus still reaches out, meets us, and brings about transformation and faith. As we continue to hear these stories, we are reminded of our own encounters with Jesus. Our own Stories of Faith.

- **Join us for worship on Sundays during Lent, as we encounter Jesus in story, song, prayer, bread, and wine.** Stay for conversation and encourage discipleship of our children through Sunday School.
- **Join us on Wednesdays during Lent for Holden Evening Prayer and as we hear from two more of our very own brothers and sisters in Christ at Good Shepherd as they share their “Stories of Faith”.** Annie Statdfield on April 2nd and Willie Kayser on April 9th. Come and be encouraged. Come for a meal, to share time and conversation together, to worship, to sing praises to God, to gather together in prayer.
- During this Season of Lent, we are reminded of our need for a Savior; we grieve our sin and our mortality. We look with need and hope to our God who brings salvation in the life, death, and

resurrection of Jesus Christ. As we celebrate together and as we grieve together...we trust in the LIFE that Jesus Christ offers. **We live into that story of salvation during Holy Week.**

Palm Sunday April 13th (9:30am): Join us for an all-congregation processional with palms during worship as we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem where the people praised him... "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Luke 19:38) "Hosanna!" Jesus knows that his entry into Jerusalem will lead to his death, but he continues in order to seek and save the lost.

Maundy Thursday April 17th (6:30pm): Join us for corporate confession and forgiveness with the option of laying on of hands. Our Gospel reading is from the last supper Jesus has with his disciples before his death. Jesus lives out Love in Action as he washes his disciples feet, and he teaches them "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." We will celebrate Holy Communion together, and the altar will be stripped as a sign of Jesus' abandonment, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Psalm 22:1).

Good Friday April 18th (6:30pm): Join us for a Service of Light and Darkness as we experience readings from the Passion according to John's where we see the Love of Jesus in Action, "When Jesus had received the wine, he said, 'It is finished.' Then he bowed down his head and gave up his spirit." (John 19:30). Between each reading we will sing reflective hymns, and we will extinguish candles throughout the service. In John, Christ is exalted on the cross. The service ends with a procession of the cross, a sign of the world's redemption.

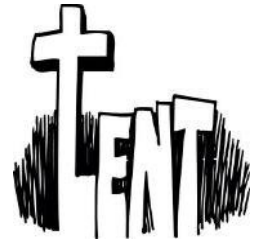
Easter April 20th (7:00am and 9:30am): Join us for celebratory services as we worship our Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We will process singing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" and hear the testimony of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ as recorded in the Gospel of Luke, "They found the stone rolled away from the tomb... 'He is not here, but has risen!'" (Luke 24:2,6). The hymns will be accompanied by brass and organ.

Join us for each of the Holy Week services as we hear once again the Story of our Salvation and the hope that we have because of Jesus' ministry, death on the cross, and resurrection!

- Time of prayer and reflection was taken for Rita Lobdell

Old Business Items:

- GSLC constitution team. Amendment suggestions received from synod as suggested updates for our constitution. Motion made by Mary Lloyd to form a constitutional task force. Motion Carried. Mary Lloyd and Pastor Miranda will be on the task force, as well as some others yet to be named.
- Mission and Ministry Fundraising Policy. Pastor updated council on the prior discussions of the last council. A lengthy discussion regarding how to establish a fundraising policy followed.
- Sunday school superintendent, two members have been reached out to about filling the position. A job description has been made by Sue D.

New Business items:

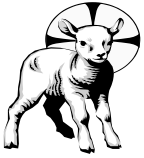
- Congregational Resourcing Event, Pastor talked about the possibility of endowment funds designations being suggested by the children. Letting the children see how the money we raise as a church is used and how that money can affect those around us.
- Life Line Screening event for the seniors is scheduled for 4/22.
- Building use. A local Zumba instructor is inquiring about using our facility to hold her once weekly class. A discussion about what Zumba is and how it would fit into our building use policy followed. Nick Baker made the motion to allow pastor to engage with the Zumba instructor about what she would need for space and the fee that council thought was appropriate. They would have to furnish a certificate of insurance and would be responsible for their own set up would have to return the room back in the same condition as they found it. Motion passed.

Committee updates:

- The scholarship committee suggests to increase dollar amount of scholarship from 500 to 750 dollars. Motion made by Troy Doubler to raise it to the 750 as suggested by committee. Motion passed.
- Pastors Report was submitted. She reviewed the highlights. She showed us the welcome bags for the new and visiting people to our church. Motion to approve pastors report made by Troy Doubler. Motion Passed.

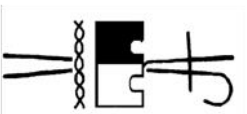
