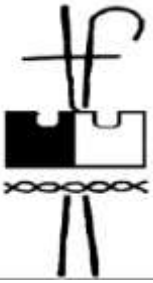


The SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him. (Luke 5:10-11)

You probably have heard the story about the call of Simon (who is also known as Peter, the Rock). He and his brother Andrew were fishermen when they met Jesus for the first time. Jesus came to their workplace and invited them to join his ministry. The Gospel of Luke recorded that Jesus said to Simon "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people."

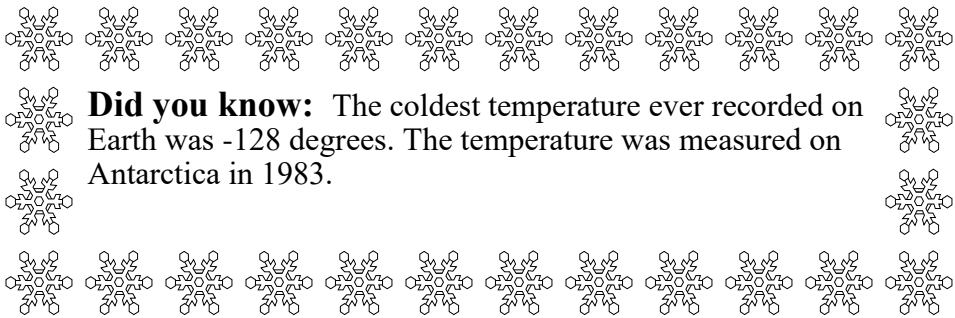
Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people. I did not pay attention to these words until I started working on this article. Do not be afraid. Why did Jesus assure Simon that he would not need to be scared or afraid? Was following Jesus a scary thing?

Two and a half years into God's call into ministry, I am gradually realizing that catching people is a scary thing. To catch people can be scary for me because it reveals my own flaws and brokenness. A big part of my ministry is going to see our members. Sometimes I see our members on stage singing with choirs, playing with bands, or performing in theater productions. I also see members on athletic fields playing baseball, football, or in track meets. All these experiences which I share with God's people are precious and holy. They are blessings. But sometimes I perceive God's blessings in critical circumstances. For instance, God has given me opportunities to walk along the final journey of one's life on earth. I did this with my mother, and I tell you it is a sacred experience. Every journey is unique and special, and I feel humbled to be present with the family members. I cry with the family and laugh with them through the sacred journeys. These are blessings. But they are blessings that also reveal my fears and wounds which I have tried to cover up. To catch people means to enter their life journeys. Through walking with God's beloved children, I faced my own flaws, brokenness, and vulnerability. It made me discouraged and made me tremble. Surely, following Jesus is a scary matter.

“Do not be afraid,” Jesus said to Simon. Catching people is scary because it requires building relationships. To build relationships we have to share our stories, stories of joys and sorrows, stories of pain and frustration, and stories of doubts and wonders. It’s not easy, but it is worth trying. “I thank you for journeying with you. Through sharing our joys and sorrows, I witness God’s presence among us. Peace in Christ, Pr. Miho

The world awaits, again, His needed glory, His promised peace.

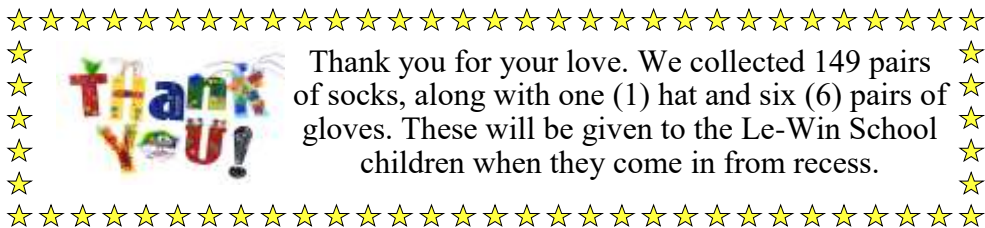
Accept His agony and receive His victory laurels

Our first Bible Study for 2019 is from the Gospel of John—”Meetings with Jesus” by Julie A Kanarr in our January “Gather Magazine”.

Highlights from January Council Meetings

- Jay Andrews reviewed the Treasurers Report. The December gas bill was \$632.56 and the electric bill was \$194.76. Kristy Patterson moved to approve the report and Krista Keene made the second. Motion passed.
- Pastor Miho provided her monthly report which included her upcoming attendance at the Professional Woman's Retreat in Rockford Jan. 28-29. She will be out of the office those days. Pastor also suggested planning a confirmation class reunion to coincide with the church's anniversary annually in March. Former pastors would be invited to attend and respective confirmads would be invited to share the worship service. Kristy Patterson moved to accept Pastor's report and Don Wienand seconded. All approved.
- Committee reports were received. Council learned youth were very busy during the month of December with Christmas events and the OWL Night (an overnight lock-in) which was well-attended.
- On behalf of the Property Committee, Denny Luke and Troy Doubler reported they are seeking a technician to inspect the elevator which is not working.
- Council learned two memorial gifts were received to be used for an eternal light. Property Committee members are researching an electrical eternal light for the sanctuary.
- Council also approved distribution of a \$1000 scholarship to Anna Patterson. Anna has successfully completed her first semester at Highland Community College and has submitted her grades which met with Scholarship Committee approval.
- Two distributions were made from Memorial funds: one toward elevator repair and the other for installation of exterior railings.
- Additional nominees for Council positions are being sought.
- Committee reports were unanimously approved with Kristy Patterson making a motion and Virgil Gordon make a second.

Highlights from January Council Meetings Cont.

- Council discussed a proposal to fund and install a sound and Power Point system in the sanctuary.
- A bid for \$10,800 for the sound system was received from Advanced Technologies Inc., Freeport, for the system. The bid includes installation assistance from the congregation. In addition, two audio sound desks will need to be purchased to store and support equipment. Cost for the desks is estimated at \$3,700. The system would be installed in the back of the sanctuary in the place of two rows of pews. Total cost of the project is estimated to be \$14,500.
- Funds for the project can be taken from the SF2 – BMI Interest fund (\$2,600); SF4- Endowment Interest Fund (\$11,500); and the SW10-Memorial Fund (\$400). Donations from the congregation are also invited.
- Making the motion to bring the project and funding proposal to the congregation for approval at the Jan 27 annual meeting was Gene Hesselbacher and Virgil Gordon provided the second. Council full approved.

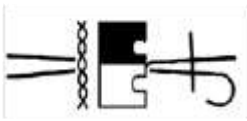
Council adjourned by standing and reciting The Lord's Prayer.
