
HISTORY ON HYMN "Morning Has Broken" ELW 556

"Morning Has Broken" is a hymn that was first published in 1931. English author Eleanor Farjeon wrote the words which was inspired by the village of Alfriston in East Sussex, then set to the traditional Scottish Gaelic tune, "Bunessan". It can be found in the section of the ELW Hymnal for "Morning".

English pop musician and folk singer Cat Stevens included a version of the hymn on his album *Teaser and the Firecat* in 1971. The song became identified with Stevens due to the popularity of this recording.

The hymn originally appeared in the second edition of *Songs of Praise* in 1931. The tune the song is set to, "Bunessan", was composed in the Scottish Islands. In *Songs of Praise*, discussed, the editor, Percy Dearmer, explains that as there was a need for a hymn to give thanks for each day, English poet and children's author Eleanor Farjeon had been asked "to make a poem to fit the lovely Scottish Tune." A slight variation of the original hymn, also written by Eleanor Farjeon, can be found in the form of a poem contributed to the anthology *Children's Bells*, under Farjeon's new title, "A Morning Song (For the First Day of Spring)", published in 1957.

The hymn tune "Bunessan" was used in the *Revised Church Hymnary* and the Appendix to the *Irish Church Hymnal* and paired with the nativity text "Child in the Manger" by the Scottish Poet Mary MacDonald (1789–1872), who lived on the Isle of Mull and was born near the village of Bunessan, for which the tune is named. After its rise to popularity with Eleanor Farjeon's text, the tune was used for a number of hymns. The hymn "Baptized in Water" (ELW 456) by Michael Steward, "This Is a Day, Lord, Gladly Awaited" (ELW 586) by Jeffery Rowthorn and "Praise and Thanksgiving" (ELW 689) by Albert F. Bayly all use the hymn tune Bunessan which is a pleasant tune to sing.

I'm a Lutheran: Carolyn Swenson

As a young adult, I left the conservative denomination I grew up in when I could no longer reconcile those beliefs with the diversity and complexity of the world. More than 20 years later I attended a music event at St. Paul and met the pastor, who turned out to be an exceptionally gifted teacher and homilist. He patiently helped me explore my doubts about Christianity and introduced me to Lutheran theology. Several years after joining St. Paul, I discovered the Order of Lutheran Franciscans, and I am now also a life-professed Franciscan.

I regularly serve as assisting minister, and it is an honor to help lead worship. St. Paul has been at the forefront of welcoming those who have been historically marginalized by the church and was an early Reconciling in Christ congregation. Participating in faith formation and education are also important to me. Our current pastor has guided us in exploring racism and white supremacy—issues that I feel are critical for the church to wrestle with and dismantle if we are serious about being true to the gospel.

I have discovered that the best way to nurture faith is to show up every week to practice it! Hearing the gospel proclaimed [and] experiencing the mystery of the liturgy and the healing wonders of music help sustain faith and hope for me.

I pursued public health because I became very interested in prevention. ... Public health views wellness as much more than the absence of disease and focuses on identifying and addressing the root causes of health inequities such as historical trauma. I currently focus on substance abuse and suicide prevention.

I chose nursing as a way to find meaningful work anywhere in the world, and that has been true for me. I've worked as a public health nurse on the Navajo reservation, with migrant farmworkers, and doing refugee relief work in Sudan.

Several years ago an interfaith coalition formed to address gun violence in Colorado. When they discovered that most firearm deaths are due to suicide, they decided to offer Question-Persuade-Refer (QPR) suicide prevention training for the general public, and I have been their volunteer trainer. The training focuses on how to recognize when a person might be thinking about suicide, and the skills to respond to offer hope and help them access support. I also train other groups. For example, I recently trained a group of veterinary leaders; veterinarians have a higher rate of suicide than many other professions.

One especially rewarding part of my work is to train school health professionals and others who work with youth on how to identify and respond to substance use and related problems from a framework of positive youth development, early intervention and restorative justice. Most people who develop an alcohol- or drug-use disorder first initiated substance use during adolescence.

Highlights from July Council Meeting

All members of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Council were present for the July 11, 2024, meeting.

Devotions and snacks were provided by Dale and Donna Gullickson followed by check in.

Property Committee: Shirley Fox, representing the Property Committee, said a bid from Carpets By Kuniej LTD for carpeting stairs and south entrance to the sanctuary at both entrances had been accepted. The bid of \$4,000 was the lowest of those received.

Memorial Committee: Janis Kurth, Memorial Committee Chair, was also present and stated funds for the carpet project will come largely from designated memorial gifts of \$3,315. Undesignated funds will be used to make up the difference. There has not been a date set for the work. Kurth also presented a list of Memorial suggestions which is now out dated. Donna Gullickson made a motion to remove seven items from the list that are no longer needed. Those items include: VBS Pool Party, Web Site as Pastor Thomas is now providing this service: Front steps railings, Electric eternal light, Video camera, DVD player, Arm chairs. One item, Refurbishing Fellowship Hall, will be added to the list. The motion passed unanimously.

In other business, Fox said the Property Committee is ready to interview someone to clean the church on a regular basis. This person will be hired as a contractor and not as a church employee. Council asked that it be informed of the decision when it is reached.

The agenda was approved on a motion and second by Donna Gullickson with the addition of discussing Sunday School. The motion passed.

Secretary's Report: The June Secretary's Report was corrected by amending it to read Bibles were handed out to 3rd grade students instead of 5th graders. A motion to accept the Secretary's Report was then made. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jay Andrews provided and reviewed the June report. A motion to accept the report was made. Council agreed unanimously.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Thomas presented his June report and it was accepted following a motion

Committee Reports:

All committee reports were also accepted.

Old Business:

Under old business, Dale Gullickson reported that she had been in contact with Nicor regarding budget billing. This plan allows the church to pay an average bill each month therefore banking money in the warm months to be applied to higher winter bills. The church can withdraw from the plan at any time. Motioned was made to accept this program. The motion passed unanimously.

Dale Gullickson also approached ComEd inquiring if a budget plan would be a benefit for electric bills, but learned the monthly charges do not vary significantly enough throughout the year to make the change.

A church member volunteer cleaning day was also discussed. A motion to have a Fall Clean Up Day Sat., Oct. 5, beginning at 9 am. All help will be appreciated. Council fully approved.
