
History of Hymns "O Beautiful for Spacious Skies" **ELW 888**

In 1892, the United States celebrated the 400th anniversary of Christopher Columbus discovery of America. Also that year, Chicago sponsored a world's Fair which carried over to the next year. In the early summer of 1893, a group of professors from Wellesley Collage attended the exposition on their way to teach summer school in Colorado. The women later compared the wonders of he man-made fair with the glory of God's handiwork in the Rockies.

When the women were done with their teaching duties, they decided to visit Pike's Peak. One of them, Katherine Lee Bates, later wrote, "We hired a prairie wagon. Near the top we had to leave the wagon and go the rest of the way on mules. When I saw the view, I felt great joy. All the wonder of America seemed displayed there with the sea-like expanse..."it was there that the opening lines of the hymn floated into her mind and by the time the group left Colorado Springs, Katherine had four stanzas written in her notebook. After returning to her collage duties, she forgot about the notebook and the four stanzas she had written. In 1985 Katharine revisited the notebook and what she had written. After recopying it, she sent it to The Congregationalist, where it first appeared in the Boston Evening Transcript, November 19, 1904.

The melody was written by Samuel A. Ward originally for a hymn entitled, "O Mother Dear, Jerusalem". Ward's son-in-law said that the tune was composted in memory of Ward's oldest daughter. Although one of Ward's employees insists that he composed the tune in 1882 while crossing New York Harbor after spending time at Coney Island. The notes came so quickly to him, that he wrote them on the cuff of his shirt.

"I'm a stressed person every day," she said. "Going to meditation [at church] has been an awesome thing for me. It just takes me to another place. I feel really close to God and Jesus."

Aivars is glad that the service has a soothing effect. "It seems like everyone is very stressed and very busy," he said, "and this service is a way to slow down and have some space to be calm."

The pastor himself began meditating seven years ago while at seminary. His inspiration for <u>meditative</u> <u>worship</u>, however, came from scrolling through Facebook and seeing advertisements and friends' posts on the benefits of meditation and mindfulness. He wondered if he could introduce this practice to members of Christ United.

Highlights from the June 13th, 2024 Council Meeting

Agenda: The Agenda for the meeting was approved as written

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report was unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report: Andrews detailed the Treasurers Report which showed an electric bill of

\$162.13 and a gas bill: \$813.81

Committee Reports:

Stewardship Committee; On behalf of the Stewardship Committee, Hudik stated that Good Shepherd brochures have been placed at the KOA. Gordon said plans are underway, for the Ice Cream Sundae Sunday and the date of July 7 was chosen. Gordon also discussed plans for the picnic to be held on church grounds Aug. 11. The menu will include meat prepared by The Mens Group – hamburgers, bratwurst and hot dogs, plus a potluck compiled by the congregation.

Learning Committee; events included Graduate Sunday and the distribution of Bibles to 5th grade students.

Property Committee; Under Property Committee items, Jay Andrews stated former janitor Christa Wichman has cashed her January check but the February and March checks remain outstanding.

The Committee Reports were approved as presented.

Old Business:

Under Old Business, a discussion was held regarding budget billing for gas and electric bills. The request will be passed on to the Property Committee for further research.

Future plans for cleaning the church drew suggestions from several members. The church is currently without a janitor.

Four Good Shepherd women organized a volunteer cleaning day covering the Fellowship Hall, bathrooms and hallways. The project took two hours. A task list was compiled for future reference.

The general consensus is to contract a cleaning service rather than hiring an employee. A church volunteer cleaning day may also be arranged on a twice yearly basis. Further planning for that arrangement will be added to the July Council agenda.

The matter will be turned over to the Property Committee for continued action.

New Business: There was no new business before the Council.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was received. Council closed by reciting The Lord's Prayer,


